## Circus Seven


a.k.a. Mind Exerciser

Masudaya, Japan, circa 1980's?
(4.25" by $1.75^{\prime \prime}$ high plastic box and seven hexagonal plastic pieces)

Arrange the seven hexagons so that adjacent edges match. Like the Circus Puzzler, but a larger size puzzle with different color patterns. This is the same puzzle as Drive Ya Nuts (the colors red, green, blue, yellow, white, and orange correspond to the numbers 1 through 6).


TKKE THE 7 BLOCKS OUT OF THE BOX AND MIX THEM UP IN A DICELIKE FR SHION. THEN PLACE THEM BACK ON THE BASE AS ORIGINALLY PACKED ARRANGING THEM SO THAT ALL FACING SURFACES ARE TRE SAME COLOR.
